

Did you attend the Annual Breakfast as a community member or a sponsor/table captain?



How would you rate the event registration process (accessing the link, filling out the form, receiving your table number, etc.)?








How would you rate the event sponsorship opportunities and benefits options?

How would you rate the effectiveness of our event visuals (screen slides, videos, signage, etc.)?







The speakers and videos gave me better insight to the Urban League's mission and impact in our community.








